

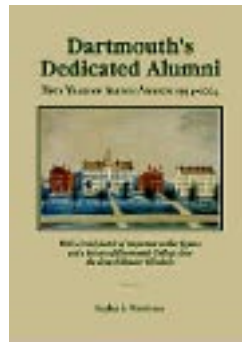

Herb West's Farewell Address was published in 2006, thanks to several classmates who recognized the contributions that Herb had made during his forty-two years teaching his Comparative Literature course. Many who took his courses and the nearly 1,100 students who packed 105 Dartmouth Hall to hear his final lecture were not aware of his other contributions founding the Friends of Dartmouth Library, collecting books and publishing numerous articles, privately printed books and trade editions. The *Dartmouth Alumni Magazine*, May/June 2007 in its Read Worthy column recently reviewed the book and concluded the piece with, "*Herb West's Farewell Address* provides a fascinating glimpse into the ever-present theme of wrangling with the administration over the freedom to discuss Dartmouth's direction, image and issues." Designed and edited by **Jim Hamilton**, who illustrated the original limited-edition letterpress 1964 edition, it includes an introduction by George Singer '50 and a bibliography by Philip Cronenwett. The 68 page book is printed in two colors, the second color serving to highlight the passages initially edited out by the College in the radio replay on WDCR.
